Overview of the initiative

Women and girls are disproportionately impacted by disasters and threats, including climate change. Due to gender-specific barriers and inequalities, women experience higher loss of lives and livelihoods during disasters and a longer recovery time. Across the board, from life expectancy to education, housing, health, safety, job security, and nutrition, women and girls are impacted more severely than men. On the other hand, women's are often drivers, strong networkers, managers, organizers and care takers in the community, playing a constructive and productive role in disaster risk reduction. Yet, still today, women tend to be categorized as victims and as a vulnerable group in need of protection from the impact of disaster failing to recognize women's capacities and contribution to disaster risk reduction and to promote their leadership, and role as change agents in building community resilience in disasters. The Indian Universities and Institutions Network on Disaster Risk Reduction-National Institute of Disaster Management, India, Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI launching the compendium on Agenda 3 of Hon'ble Prime Minister of India 10 points on DRR, "Role of Women in Disaster Risk Management" which aims to highlight the ability and capacity of women in disaster risk reduction. Hence, the proposed initiative would like to compile those practices which are taken by universities and institutions on women involvements and their potential for all aspects of disaster risk management.
